Dear Praying Friends,

So much has happened in the last few months. Let me tell you about some recent blessings on a trip I was able to make to Nicaragua and Honduras in November of this year.

Nicaragua—God allowed me to participate in the graduation of the Bible Institute in Managua, Nicaragua. This was the 40th anniversary of the Institute and the 37th graduation. What a joy it was to see 14 men who have been trained to spread the Gospel. Eleven of these have already started a church or will start a new church in the coming months. The other three are praying for God's direction. Praise the Lord for the vision of Dr. Bob Dayton to maintain this center of learning. Dr. Dayton just celebrated 50 years in missions.

Tegucigalpa—After leaving Nicaragua, I arrived in the capital city of Honduras. I was there to spend time with Brother Carlos Johnson. Brother Carlos has started several churches in Tegucigalpa. His late wife, Ruby, also started a Christian Day School which continues to function under Honduran leadership. Please be in prayer for Brother Carlos and the ministry of "La Iglesia Bautista Betania" the Bethany Baptist Church.



Campamento, Olancho—Leaving the big city of Tegucigalpa (over 1 million), I headed toward the country town of Campamento where Daniel & Abigail Jacobo are faithfully serving the Lord. They are in desperate need of a building. At present, the church is meeting in their carport and backyard but the Sunday I was there, the attendance was 68. The church is only 13 months old.

La Paz—The main reason for my trip was to participate in an Evangelistic Conference in the city of La Paz with veteran missionaries Chester & Violet Sheren. We had great fellowship with many national pastors.

Many decisions were made during the conference. There were 27 church members that came forward expressing their desire to serve the Lord in full time ministry. On Wednesday afternoon, about 150 soul winners covered the entire city of La Paz. There were 276 people that made professions of faith in Christ that day. Contact information was gathered on these converts. Pray for Brother Chester and the other local pastors as they follow up.



El Progreso, Yoro—My final stop was the city of El Progreso and the ministry of Matt & Dallita Goins. God has truly blessed this work. The attendance on Sunday was over 250. Forty-six church folk showed up for visitation on Saturday afternoon. I had the privilege of going door-to-door with Marlon. Marlon has been saved for a little over a year and has already surrendered his life to the Lord to serve full time as a preacher of the Gospel.
